



What type of purple Weigela do I need?

When it comes to picking the proper weigela to plant in your location you need to consider how large you want the plant to be when it matures. The purple leaf weigela that we carry all look the same when they are in a pot and young, but they grow to different sizes when they mature. They all have the same dark purple leaf and get a pink trumpet flower to them, so don't worry about that. All you need to

figure out is what the final size of the plant should be. So let's take a look at the five different varieties that we carry at Christensen's and how large or small they will end up being.

Starting with the biggest, 'Wine & Roses' will grow to be 4' to 5' tall and the same in width. Next we have 'Dark Horse' which will grow to be 3' by 3'. There is also 'Fine Wine' that will be about the same as 'Dark Horse', but can get a little taller maxing out at 4'. As we continue to get smaller there

is 'Spilled Wine' that can be 2' by 3' at the max. Finally we have 'Midnight Wine' which will only get to 1' by 2' at its mature size.

I hope that this information will help you pick out the Weigela that is right for your location. Also please remember that they all flower on old wood so any pruning that you need to do needs to be done right after they are done flowering.
