## Sowing grass seed

A good time to seed a lawn is in the spring after the last frost. In Michigan, cool weather grasses such as Kentucky Bluegrass, Fescue, and Rye will give a lawn it's best chance. Do not plant in extreme heat or cold, as these abnormal temps will make it difficult for the seeds to germinate. Check the weather and sow your seeds the day of or before rain, being careful of hard rains, which cause seeds to run off your lawn. Dirt needs to remain moist for up to two weeks during germination, so water, water, and more water.
